

How Sauchuk's Corn Maze & Pumpkin Patch will Comply with Workplace Safety Standards

Social Distancing

Tickets with timed entry will be sold in advance to limit attendance and space out admissions.

Daily attendance will be limited to 40% of estimated capacity, or no more than 1600 people, spaced evenly over a 9-hour day. Support for this capacity that allows for social distancing is shown in the Addendum.

Attractions and events that tend to draw a crowd will be eliminated, such as the corn box, pig races, candy cannon, and special events.

Picnic tables in the Pavilion will be spaced at least 6 feet apart.

Hay wagon capacity will be reduced from 100 to only 25 people to allow for social distancing.

Certain activities, such as duck races, roller bowler, and skee-ball, will be limited to prevent participants from playing next to each other.

Parking will be spaced to allow for a 6-foot buffer on either side of every car.

Separate outside entrance and exits to the courtyard area will be established.

The front door to the barn will be closed, and the number of people in the barn will be monitored and limited to allow for adequate spacing.

Signage will be used to remind people of safe social distancing

Lines for the various attractions will be marked at 6-foot intervals to remind people of the required spacing.

Staggered lunch breaks for employees will promote social distancing in the break room.

Hygiene Protocols

All guests and employees will be required to wear masks, except when eating and seated.

Hand-washing stations, with soap, running water, and paper towels, will be provided for both employees and customers.

Hand sanitizer stations, using alcohol-based sanitizers with at least 60% ethanol, will be provided for both employees and customers.

Signage will be posted to remind employees of hygiene and safety protocols.

Daily cleaning and sanitization of all high-touch surfaces will be conducted.

Employees in each area or station will be provided with adequate cleaning products, such as sanitizers and disinfecting wipes.

Staffing and Operations

An employee will be dedicated to logging in all employees prior to the beginning of their shifts, including taking their temperature and asking questions about possible COVID-19 symptoms. Employees exhibiting a fever or possible symptoms will be sent home.

At least one person from each household/car will provide contact information, through online reservations, to allow for contact tracing should it be necessary.

Training will be provided to all employees regarding these workplace safety standards.

If Sauchuk Farm is notified of a positive case at the farm, the Plympton Board of Health will be alerted.

Cleaning and Disinfecting

Cow train, bee train, hay-wagons, and jumping pillows will be sanitized not less than daily using a fogger and approved sanitizers.

O.K. corral guns (paintball-style) and goggles will be sanitized after each use. Goggles will be sprayed with an alcohol-based cleaner/sanitizer and wiped with a clean tissue, and the guns will be cleaned with disinfecting wipes.

Picnic tables will be cleaned and disinfected after each use.

Regular and not less than daily cleaning and sanitization of all high-touch areas will be conducted.

Cleaning logs will show that date, time, and scope of cleaning.
